

Ranges of Disciplinary Consequences

(Student Discipline Code - Pursuant to New York State Education Law Section 2801)

DETENTION PROCEDURES

- Faculty member notices a student disobeying a classroom rule or a building-wide PRIDE principle
- Faculty member explains which rule was disobeyed and how the misbehavior broke the rule
- Faculty member writes a discipline referral
- Faculty member notifies the student's parents of the referral and why it was written
- Administration/Dean of Students will assign appropriate consequences.
- Students must report to detention on the assigned day and at the assigned time.
- Students who arrive late or do not serve the duration of the detention will make up the time they missed on the next assigned day
- Talking or sleeping will not be permitted
- Students will be seated in the room according to teacher direction

IN-SCHOOL SUSPENSION PROCEDURE (ISS)

Only the principal can assign ISS.

- Eating will only be permitted during the designated lunchtime.
- Talking or sleeping is not permitted.
- Visitors will not be allowed to enter the ISS room. Violators will receive a verbal warning from the ISS teacher, and a written referral will be submitted to the Principal for further disciplinary action.
- Students in ISS wanting to buy lunch will have it delivered from the cafeteria. Students must have lunch money with them at the beginning of the day.
- Behavior not complying with the above rules will be reported to the administration. This behavior may result in the student re-serving the ISS or receiving further discipline.

TABLE A – DISORDERLY/DISRUPTIVE CONDUCT

Conduct likely to lead to a disturbance of the public peace, that offends public decency, or interrupts instruction in some way. Students have a right to a safe, healthy, orderly, and civil school environment. Any conduct that interferes with such an environment or with instruction is considered disruptive.

TABLE D – ENDANGERING THE SAFETY, MORALS, HEALTH, OR WELFARE OF OTHERS

Definitions:

Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school-aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. Conduct that occurs between individuals and/or groups of people and is defined ALL of the following components:

- 1) it is an intentional, mean behavior
- 2) it occurs repeatedly, AND
- 3) it occurs in a relationship characterized by an imbalance of strength and/or power.

Harassment is any word, communication or action based in whole or in part upon actual or perceived race (including historical traits associated with race, like hair texture and hairstyles), color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender (including gender identity or expression) or sex, as well as marital status, veteran status, appearance or other physical attribute for which there is no legitimate purpose.

Hazing is any willful action taken or situation created, alone or acting together, which recklessly, intentionally, or through coercion endangers the physical or mental health of another. The individuals may be willing or unwilling to participate. Hazing is an activity that in some way humiliates another person who lacks the power to resist because he or she wants to be admitted to the group. It can be any action taken or situation created intentionally to produce mental or physical discomfort, humiliation, harassment, or ridicule.

RESPONDING TO ALLEGATIONS OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT AND/OR HAZING

When staff or adults observe incidents of bullying, harassment, and/or hazing, the adults are mandated to respond in accordance with the MCSD Code of Conduct. Even if the recipient of the bullying, harassment, and/or hazing behaviors requests that no action be taken or that a report not be made of the incident, the school is obligated to follow the procedures in Board Policy 0015 and consequences of bullying, harassment, and/or hazing as delineated in the MCSD Code of Conduct.

- c. Violates copyright law.
- d. Demonstrates the intent to harm or diminish another student's academic record for the purpose of self-advancement.
